

To begin the conversation: Today's 3 E's Definition of Trauma

"Individual trauma results from an event, series of events, or set of circumstances that is experienced by an individual as physically or emotionally harmful or life threatening and that has lasting adverse effects on the individual's development, functioning and mental, physical, social, emotional, or spiritual well-being."

Prevalence of ACEs

- At least **59 percent** of the general population has experienced at least one adverse childhood event
- **Twenty-six percent**of children in the United States will witness or experience a traumatic event before they turn four
- **Four of every 10**children in America say they experienced a physical assault during the past year, with **1 in 10** receiving an assault-related injury
- More than 60 percent of youth age 17 and younger have been exposed to crime, violence and abuse either directly or indirectly



Life-Long Physical, Mental & Behavioral Health Outcomes Linked to ACEs

- Alcohol, tobacco & other drug addiction
 - 🛯 Auto-immune disease
- Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease & ischemic heart disease
- Depression, anxiety & other mental illness
 - 🛚 Diabetes
 - Multiple divorces
 - 🕼 Fetal death
- High risk sexual activity, STDs & unintended pregnancy

- Intimate partner violence perpetration & victimization

- ℜ Skeletal fractures
- Suicide attempts
- Work problems including absenteeism, productivity & on-thejob injury

What Does a Trauma-Informed Organization Include?

- **Cultural competence and humility**
- **Consumer voice**, choice and advocacy
- Recovery, consumer-driven and trauma specific services
- Realing, hopeful, honest and trusting relationships
- System-wide understanding of trauma prevalence, impact and trauma-informed care
