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Illinois Opioid STR

- State Targeted Response to the Opioid Crisis Grant (Opioid STR)
- Part of the 21st Century Cures Act
- Administered by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA)
- \$16 million
- 5/1/2017 – 4/30/2018
- Year 2: TBD

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STR Purpose

Address the opioid crisis by increasing access to treatment, reducing unmet treatment need, and reducing opioid overdose related deaths through the provision of prevention, treatment and recovery activities for opioid use disorder (OUD) (including prescription opioids as well as illicit drugs such as heroin).

STR Competitive Bids

- Expanded Outpatient Methadone
- Expanded Recovery Home Services for Individuals with an OUD who are Participating in Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)
- Illinois Opioid Crisis Line

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STR Treatment and Recovery Support Projects

- Hospital Emergency Department-Based Screening, Recovery Coaching, and Linkage Services
- Pre-Release Medication Assisted Treatment (Vivitrol) and Post-Release Linkage to Community Based Services for County Jail Prisoners and Drug Court Offenders with OUD in Counties of High Need
- Community Triage Center – Chicago Westside
- Suboxone Education/Consultation/Support for Medical Staff

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STR Prevention/Other Projects

- Expanded Naloxone (Narcan) Purchase, Training, and Distribution Services
- Expansion and Enhancement of the Illinois Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP)
- Establishment of a Statewide Opiate Awareness Campaign

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DASA Opioid-Related Initiatives Overview

Drug Overdose Prevention Program

Functions:

- Enrolls entities in DOPP and tracks enrollment
- Offers training, guidelines
- Collects data on training and overdose reversals

Enrolled Program Responsibilities:

- Operate local DOPP
- Recruit and train multiple sites within their communities to administer Naloxone and report overdose reversals
- May include substance use disorder treatment programs, community-based organizations, health care facilities, and faith-based organizations, as well as agencies engaged with incarcerated individuals
- Provided with assistance with access to Naloxone. (May include funds for purchasing medicine, but always includes training for access.)

Grants to Prevent Overdose-Related Deaths (PDO)

\$1M/year for 5 years
 •Funded by SAMHSA

Project goals:

- Expand the existing infrastructure ... to prevent overdose-related deaths
- Reduce numbers of overdose-related deaths in six high need counties
- Increase availability of Naloxone to first responders
- Measure the short and long-term outcomes of the program

State Targeted Response to the Opioid Crisis Grant Program (STR)

\$16M/year; may be renewed for 2nd year
 •21st Century Cures Act funding, administered by SAMHSA

Components:

- Multiple approaches and programs to address the opioid crisis through prevention, treatment, and recovery approaches
- Opioid overdose prevention projects based on PDO goals and approach

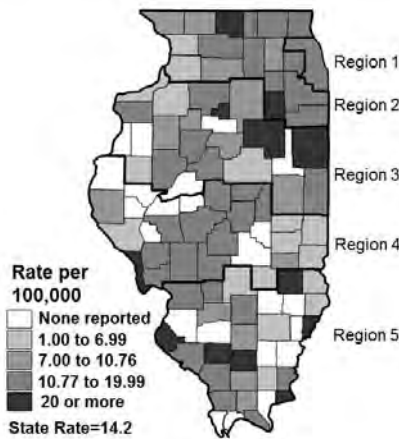
