Training Description:

This training focuses on the implementation of Collaborative Documentation (CD), a process whereby a clinician and client/family work together to develop documentation of all core elements of the clinical/ rehabilitation process (i.e. Assessment, Treatment Plan, Progress Notes). The training also outlines core compliance concepts and documentation strategies needed to support the value and ease of implementation of Collaborative Documentation.

Training Objectives:

Participants will gain a better understanding of:

- 1. The relationship between documentation, compliance, and clinical quality.
- 2. Collaborative documentation benefits, obstacles, and implementation strategies.
- 3. Documentation element rules and definitions needed to support CD and medical necessity.
- 4. Collaborative Documentation strategies for the assessment, treatment plan and progress notes.
- 5. Basic elements of person centered and person driven strategies that support CD in clinical work and documentation.
